Mr. Brig Barker recently retired after 20 years as a counterterrorism agent with the FBI. During his career he spent the majority of his time on a Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF) with extensive overseas deployments. He originally spent five years working as a case agent on a JTTF where he was a SWAT operator and FBI certified sniper.

Further, Mr. Barker was a JTTF Squad Supervisor and Counterterrorism Program Coordinator in two separate FBI offices. In addition, Mr. Barker was selected and served as the embedded Senior FBI Advisor at DOD Special Operations Command (SOCOM). At the conclusion of his assignment, Mr. Barker was awarded a commendation medal for his efforts against Al Qaida. During his career with the FBI, he conducted numerous Counterterrorism deployments throughout Africa, the Middle East, Europe, and the U.K. In 2014, he completed a deployment to Tunisia. Mr. Barker further deployed to Nairobi, Kenya and Kampala, Uganda in 1998 as part of the Al Qaida Embassy Bombings investigation, as well as to Cairo, Egypt immediately after the attacks on 9/11/2001. In 2006, Mr. Barker opened the Freetown, Sierra Leone FBI office. In all, Mr. Barker has lived overseas for a total of five years and has traveled to and worked in Tanzania, Botswana, the UAE, Turkey, Iraq, Lithuania, El Salvador, Honduras, and the UK.



Mr. Barker further was the primary Counterterrorism Interrogation instructor for the FBI Training Division for two years. Mr. Barker is an FBI trained Arabic speaker and is conversational in Farsi and German. Mr. Barker further graduated from the U.S. Government Personnel Recovery/Captivity course and a Tactical Overseas Driving course in N. Africa.

He has 10+ Counterterrorism articles professionally published in Law Enforcement and DOD publications to include the primary Interrogation article for the West Point Counterterrorism textbook, *Terrorism and Political Islam*. His Masters thesis, “Decoding the Language of Jihad”, a comprehensive study in Islamic statement analysis and exegesis, was published in *Middle East Quarterly*. His articles include “ISIS: Nothing new under the sun” and “Salafi/Takfiri Micro-Theology: The Non Illusive And Motivational Ideology Behind Jihadist Attacks In The 21st Century”. Prior to the FBI, Mr. Barker spent five years as a Ranger and Jumpmaster qualified Army officer with the majority of his time in the 82nd Airborne. While in the military, Mr. Barker earned the rating of Senior Parachutist and obtained the German and Italian Parachutist Wings. He deployed as a Weapons Company Executive Officer to Northern Iraq in 1991 as part of combat operations.

Mr. Barker is considered one of the top counterterrorism experts in the country, a keynote speaker at high level conferences, and a regular contributor/advisor to the national media on terrorism issues.



George Carey retired as a Deputy Chief of Police after a distinguished 30 year career in law enforcement in California. During his career Mr. Carey spent 20 years on a SWAT team to include extensive time as the commander of a multi-agency SWAT team. He is considered an expert in covert building entry and technical surveillance countermeasure (TSCM) techniques and taught specialized entry skills to U.S. Special Operations forces and law enforcement officers for 17 years. In all, he has trained over 4000 personnel from 400 different units and agencies.

Mr. Carey is a Vietnam veteran having served as a combat hospital corpsman with the U.S. Marines. While in Vietnam, Mr. Carey participated in rapid response missions, long-range reconnaissance operations, and MIA recoveries.

In the private sector, Mr. Carey has been a trainer and security consultant in the non-governmental sector for over 20 years. He has traveled across the globe responding to real world hostage cases, providing crisis management and field security training, and conducting risk and security assessments. Mr. Carey has traveled extensively throughout the Middle East, Africa, Europe, and Asia and has operated in or trained personnel in countries such as Yemen, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Kenya, Oman, Nigeria, Ecuador, Venezuela, and Colombia to name a few.



Mr. Carey holds a bachelor's degree from San Diego State University, is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, and has attended the FBI Hostage Negotiations Course as well as a private-sector hostage negotiations course with an emphasis on international kidnapping cases. He is one of the few hostage negotiators in the U.S. with experience handling international kidnapping cases or providing support in the resolution of such cases.

Mr. Carey has had several articles published on the subjects of stealth building entries during high risk tactical situations as well as regarding the deployment of tactical emergency medical personnel during crisis situations.
